The plastics industry has a new trick for making and selling even more wasteful single-use plastic.

It's pushing a practice deceptively called "chemical recycling," which is really just burning plastics to turn them into fuel -- and pumping out toxic pollution in the process.

As special interests in the industry continue ramping up their support for the expansion of this harmful practice, let's sort fact from fiction.

The vast majority of plastic is never recycled. That's despite the plastics industry's insistence that throwing plastic in the blue bin can reliably and substantially curb plastic pollution.

Companies have maintained a status quo where the burden of recycling all this "stuff" falls squarely on the consumer and taxpayer -- keeping themselves blissfully free from accountability for the mountains of plastic waste they're responsible for creating.

The industry's latest greenwashing attempt is something it's calling "chemical recycling." It says it can reclaim some of the chemicals from plastic products by burning them. But that's not really recycling. Burning is dirty -- and many of the chemicals that don't get recovered are spewed into the air as harmful pollution.

Later, the leftover waste from this incineration process simply gets burned once more and then discarded at hazardous waste facilities. And worse still, that deceptive label allows plastic producers to avoid air quality standards and skip investing in pollution controls.
