

#### FROM MENNONITE ACTION...

Check out the Colorado Springs <u>Gazette article here</u>. This week, Mennonites arrived in Washington, D.C. from across North America—including from here in the Mountain States Mennonite Conference—to take peaceful action for a permanent ceasefire in Gaza. Nearly 150 Mennonites were arrested in the Cannon House Rotunda as they sang, prayed, and demanded a ceasefire. Outside, about 200 Mennonites of all ages stood vigil at an outdoor service.

Mennonite Action's US Petition for a Ceasefire crossed the threshold of our 5,000 signature goal. The Coordinating Team says, "We felt the blessing of thousands of friends, family members, and congregations around us, lifting us up and giving us strength."

## FROM GOSHEN COLLEGE...

Mary K. Oyer, professor emerita of music, died on January 11, 2024, in Goshen at the age of 100.

Oyer taught at Goshen College from 1945 to 1987, during which time she developed a Fine Arts course that became legendary among students and was instrumental in bringing wide recognition and acceptance of the fine arts in a Mennonite liberal arts education. She introduced more than 5,000 students to the fundamentals of art and music. Oyer is recognized as being integral in shaping what Mennonite music sounds like today. She was instrumental in gathering hymns and songs for the widely used 1969 and 1992 Mennonite hymnals, and for more than six decades taught those hymns to the wider church in myriad worship settings, including national conventions and world conferences. She is well known for her role in helping establish the hymn "Praise God From Whom," better known as "606," as the Mennonite "anthem" after she led it in 1969 at the church-wide assembly in Oregon.

### FROM MENNONITE EDUCATION AGENCY...

Applications will be accepted through April 1, 2024, for the MEA Scholarship for BIPOC Students within Mennonite Church USA (MC USA), for the 2024-25 academic year. The scholarship was launched in the fall of 2023 to help students who identify as Black, Indigenous, or People of Color (BIPOC), and who are active in MC USA congregations, to

attend a Mennonite college, university, or seminary that is partnered with MEA. Said MEA's Executive Director Michael Danner, "MEA's goal with this scholarship is to help

more BIPOC students access the quality education they can get at Anabaptist Mennonite schools."

The scholarship is also intended to further the education of future church leaders in MC USA. An applicant's active involvement in a local congregation and vocational objectives will be considered.
