Peaceful Options for Training and Careers (POTC), an independent initiative formed by Mennonite Church USA and Mennonite Central Committee, has begun training volunteer counselors to help young adults find non-military career, service and training opportunities.

POTC addresses the widespread issue of military recruitment on high school campuses. Since the passage of the 2001 No Child Left Behind Act, public high schools who receive assistance through the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) of 1965 are required to give the military as much access to campuses and student contact information as is given to postsecondary institutions and prospective employers. Approximately two-thirds of public high schools receive federal Title 1 ESEA funding. Sometimes, local school boards or teachers' unions try to resist this requirement. In July 2023, Congressman Max Miller of Ohio introduced a bill, H.R. 4522, to eliminate this by strengthening ESEA "to ensure access of Armed Forces recruiters to secondary school campuses, and for other purposes." FROM MENNONITE ACTION...

On January 16th, 2024, hundreds of Mennonites and interfaith allies met in Washington, DC for a historic gathering calling for an immediate ceasefire in Gaza. Nearly 150 Mennonites were arrested on Capitol Hill in an act of peaceful civil disobedience, singing hymns and praying for peace in a federal building. About 200 additional people held a simultaneous peace vigil outside the building. And a small group delivered a petition with thousands of signatures to our elected officials. Together, we sent a message to our political leaders, our fellow community members, and our Palestinian, Jewish, Arab and Muslim loved ones that there are Christians and Mennonites who stand with them in their call for peace and a ceasefire now.

FROM MENNONITE EDUCATION AGENCY...

Applications will be accepted through April 1, 2024, for the MEA Scholarship for BIPOC Students within Mennonite Church USA (MC USA) for the 2024-25 academic year. The scholarship was launched in the fall of 2023 to help students who identify as Black, Indigenous, or People of Color (BIPOC), and who are active in MC USA congregations, to attend a Mennonite college, university, seminary that is partnered with MEA. Said MEA's Executive Director Michael Danner, "MEA's goal with this scholarship is to help more BIPOC students access the quality education they can get at Anabaptist Mennonite schools."
